Oh, ya. When you change your oil in your flat tappet engine, be sure you use the real oil, like VR-1, Shell Rotella and the other Diesel, competition, performance oils. The oil you put in your everyday driver just does not belong in your "older style" engine.

And we can't forget the so called "gas" in the tank. It's no doubt 10% + corn when you put it in last year. Now it's three things – corn infused low octane on top, very low octane gasoline and on the bottom more low octane fuel and WATER! Yup, WATER! The corn [alcohol] not only evaporates leaving crappy gas but in the process attracts moisture – aka water. Used a product like Sta-Bil? Good deal but the process still goes on! Corn fuel has a shelf life of 100 days or less when in your unsealed tank or gas can in the garage.

And then there are the tires. How old are they? Are they properly inflated? They do loose pressure over winter, in the cold. Remember, as good as they are, tires like so many things are just not what they were or seem to be. They can and do dry rot inside where you can't see. Just a cautionary note as you hit the interstate at 65 to 75 MPH or whatever!

More on CORN in your tank!!

"I DON'T DRIVE MY '55 MUCH SO I'M NOT TOO CONCERNED."

Pictured to the left is what IS going on not only there in the [your] carburetor be it vintage Stromberg 97, big Holly or Carter but also everywhere else in your fuel system from and including the tank, pump lines and filter. Eating away at the very metal," plastic" and other sometimes non-fixable parts, KORN IS THE KILLER!

[Corn is, of course, a staple of our economy, it's in nearly everything especially what we eat and now, as we all know, is

in greater amounts in what we feed our pride and joy. Corn is getting a maybe well-deserved bad rap in that it's being determined to be not so good for humans - and the corn industry needs to replace what we are not eating? And, of course there is the "green thing" that's going on.]

HERE IS THE LATEST -

While E15 availability has slowly spread across the Midwest over the last couple of years, a handful of provisions included in the [2014] federal farm bill passed earlier will effectively make the continued roll-out of the ethanol-blended fuel more difficult, if not stop it in its tracks entirely.

The <u>Agricultural Act of 2014</u>, which passed into law February 7, primarily set the federal government's food and agricultural policies for the next several years. Perhaps the provision most crippling to the push for widespread E15 adoption, however, was the one cutting a Rural Energy for America Program subsidy that would help gas stations install as many as 10,000 E15 blender pumps over the next two to five years. Rather than dispense pre-blended E15, the blender pumps would instead mix the gasoline and ethanol in the specified blend, whether that be E10, E15, E85, or other <u>discussed but yet-to-be-approved blends</u>. The ethanol industry has long seen blender pumps as key to increasing demand for E15.

Reuters <u>credited the subsidy cut</u> in the farm bill to lobbying by the <u>American Motorcyclist Association</u>, which <u>noted in a press release</u> that it "has repeatedly expressed concerns about potential E15 misfueling and the

subsequent damage that the fuel can have on motorcycle and ATV engines and fuel systems. The AMA believes that blender pumps dispensing E15 at service stations will create a high potential for inadvertent E15 misfueling by consumers."

"it has not approved it [E15] for use in motorcycles, ATVs, small engines, or in vehicles older than the 2001 model year."

While the Environmental Protection Agency in 2011 approved E15 use in 2001 and newer passenger and light-duty vehicles, it has not approved it for use in motorcycles, ATVs, small engines, or in vehicles older than the 2001 model year. According to a <u>list published by the Renewable Fuels Association</u>, E15 is now available in 59 gas stations across 12 states, up from about a couple dozen about a year ago.

WE ARE MORE FORTUNATE THAN MANY -

BUT, it's up to US to protect our investment whether we chose to use carburetors or not. 10% fuel is all we can get with the exception of some agricultural and non-regular fuel points. Use the available additives to protect the system. E15 AND THE POTENTIAL ISSUE(S) ABOVE ARE MORE WORRYSUM. As pointed out by our partners in the off road, boating and motorcycle hobby, misfueling can be catastrophic - in a hurry. READ THE PUMP!

I have been told "I don't drive my '55 much so I'm not too concerned." If there is corn in your tank you are not immune from the problem - and it will show up when you least want it to!

NOW IS A GOOD TIME TO UPDATE THE INDIANA LIST OF INDIANA STATE AND FEDERAL LEGISLATORS WHO ACTIVELY SUPPORT THE AUTOMOTIVE HOBBY BY BEING A PART OF AUTOMOTIVE ENTHUSIAST LEADERSHIP CAUCUSES.



State legislators around the country with a common goal to support the motor vehicle hobby have joined the State Automotive Enthusiast Leadership Caucus. The Caucus is a bi-partisan group of state lawmakers whose common thread is a love and appreciation for automobiles. The Caucus will help raise the motor vehicle hobby's profile in the state legislatures and in the eyes of the public. Working in state capitals, many of these legislators have sought to preserve and protect the hobby by seeking the amendment of existing motor vehicle statutes and creating new programs to safeguard and expand the hobby. Over the past several years, their work has brought a series of significant legislative accomplishments for the vehicle enthusiast community on issues ranging from equipment standards to registration classifications, and from emissions test exemptions to hobbyist rights. By joining the Caucus, these legislators have demonstrated their commitment to upholding the rights of vehicle enthusiasts. In addition, hobbyists will be able to quickly identify which state legislators have chosen to be recognized for their support of this great American hobby.

The American automotive specialty and performance industry is an important economic engine, with consumer sales of motor vehicle performance and appearance enhancement equipment annually over \$32 billion, while providing jobs for a million Americans. Motorsports events rank among the most widely attended of all U.S. sports.

Another aspect of our nation's heritage which has played an integral role in fostering America's love for motorsports in general and the automobile in particular is the collector car. ran in Brown County, Indiana. WHAT WAS and WHAT IS this thing called "Cider Run"? What caused car folk to gather under the early Fall trees in the flora and fauna of the "Hills 'o Brown"? All good questions with many a long answer some of which are based on stories by fabricators and tellers of tales. That should surprise no one because much of the lore of Brown County, "Peaceful Valley", Nashville, IN bears the same heritage. TALL tales. A visit to the Inn within the State Park of Brown County and other equally "Brown Countyish" spots have displays depicting the true and not so true tales. But, Cider Run? And preferably one of several "short" versions, please!

Pretty simple, actually. Hotrodders. Monthly gatherings. Fall [still is] one of many preferred times to meet up with friends. Hot spot is hills with fall color. Wala, Brown County! Apple pickin' and squeezin' season in them hills. Wala [again], rod run becomes "Cider Run". Been that way for over forty years, forty two to be exact in the fourteenth year of this century. [Don't get out a calendar - that's 2014.] Pretty simple. All under the banner of the Indiana Street Rod Association - ISRA.

Also simple then was the fact that Hot Rods were, well "Hot Rods". Of course, that was changin' rapidly thanks to where the "car culture" was morphing to. Hot Rods had to become more "socially acceptable" - a subject for another time, for sure. Now they were already "Street Rods". [Could have been "Road Rods but that doesn't even ring well and the way things are today we would be not permitted in other states to drive on city "streets" without special permits - again a story for another day!] The ISRA held meetings around the state back in the late '60's. Mostly in central state as the bulk - but certainly not all - of the early membership was centered mid-state. One of

the Hot Rod clubs responsible for the beginnings of the ISRA was from Indy... the "Busters" or something. And of course there were others, too. Hot Rodders.

Oh, ya... Cider Run, doughnuts and sometimes yellow jackets, too. As the story goes, a guy with a '23 "T", Wendell Perry, suggested "the meeting shall become an event and it shall be called 'Cider Run'". And, so it was and is and shall remain to be. It all began in Brown County State Park. A couple locations were




used but the preferred was the north gate "pool" area. There were the usual awards and recognitions as well as "drive by" awards for friends to bestow upon friends. Many families enjoyed the weekend camping with many staying in the few motels and cabins that were available at the time in the area. It became a two day event with evening entertainment by participants and others. Oh, and lots of food.

In the mid-'80's the location changed further north to the Brown County Fair Grounds for reasons only known to those telling the story Good location, good facilities but members yearned to return to the Park. And so it did.

That's the almost short story version. Every member and participant does have and will share their personal experiences from over the years. The event has done well to hang on to its cultural heritage and history even in the face of huge changes within the hobby. We have learned to extend our hands to all cultures be they antiques, hot rods, street rods, street machines, muscle cars or whatever is next. After all, CIDER RUN THE ROD RUN WAS AND STILL IS - ALL ABOUT PEOPLE, FRIENDS, GOOD TIMES and, of course, FOOD AND CIDER!!

My name is Ron Short. I live in Greenfield, In. and am a member of ISRA and Brandywine Cruisers car club. I bought a mostly restored 1965 Chevelle Malibu on May 10, 2013. The car new had a 327-300 H.P. motor with a Muncie M20 four speed. The previous owner installed a 402 big block bored .030 over with a 595 solid lift cam and lifters. He reworked the heads and added Harlan Sharp roller rockers. He also installed a Weiland high rise intake with a Holley 750 carb. The exhaust consists of Hooker competition

headers and mufflers. The rear end is a 12 bolt chevy

4.11 with Eaton positrac. The previous owner used the car as a drag car.

I wanted to use the car as a cruiser, so I made some changes to make the car more streetable. Some of the changes include replacing the cam and lifters with a Crane hydraulic 550 lift. This is a great cam for street and strip. Next I added a power brake booster to improve braking. The last major change was

replacing the

2 M20

transmission with a 5 speed Tremec TKO 600. This allows the car to cruise 65 MPH at 2100 RPM as opposed to the M20 at 3100RPM. I am currently in the process of installing an IDIDIT tilt steering column.

In the last 8 months, I have truly enjoyed working on and mostly cruising the car. I was able to take it to Cider Run and my wife and I had a very good time. I am looking forward to 2014 for another cruising season. Thanks to all my Hot Rod friends for their help with my project. See you all at the shows. — Ron Short #1890



Ohio Bill to Expand Use of Historical Vehicles Approved by House; Moves to Governor]

Legislation to <u>amend</u> the state's current <u>law defining historical motor vehicles</u> to <u>permit their use on public roads</u> to and from a location where maintenance is performed was approved by the full House of Representatives. Under current Ohio law, a "historical motor vehicle" is any motor vehicle that is more than twenty-five years old and owned solely as a collector's item and for participation in club activities, exhibitions, tours, parades, and similar uses, but not for general transportation.

Interpret this as you may.... But the terms "permit" and" public roads"...... a real concern especially for those who register their "historical motor vehicle" (antique) as such.. and in Indiana that includes "permission to display year of manufacture plate!!"
